They bought and refurbished a ski home in Thornton Gore, New Hampshire. They traveled extensively, enjoying the theater, opera and classical music in Europe and in the States. They enjoyed sailing, skied all over the world and kept company with many famous drama and theater personalities. In 1978, Chuck went back to school at age 42, and became a computer programmer, a new and growing field, and started work with the New England Telephone company, where he retired early in 1994. They enjoyed this wonderful, sophisticated life until late 1994 when Kevin passed. Devastated, it was now just Chuck and the ever protective and faithful Emma, Chuck and Kevin's English setter. Emma provided the strength that Chuck needed to weather this storm.

In 1995, a good friend introduced Chuck to the Boston Prime Timers and he quickly used his computer skills to develop the database still used by the group today.
